DIY PROJECT

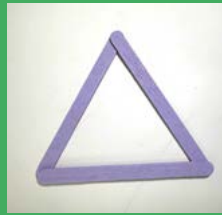
POPSICLE STICK BRIDGES THAT KIDS CAN BUILD

What you will need:
27 Popsicle sticks and hot glue

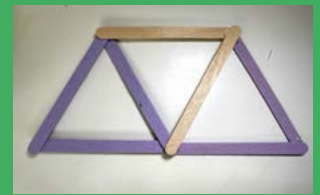
Instructions

Bridge Walls/ Truss

1. Pick 3 popsicle sticks and make a triangle. This will make the walls of the bridge.



2. Once you have made one triangle, keep adding a stick at a time (Add top stick, Add diagonal stick, Add bottom stick, Add diagonal stick, to make a truss.



3. Repeat step 2 to make the 2nd wall. You should have 2 bridge walls in total.

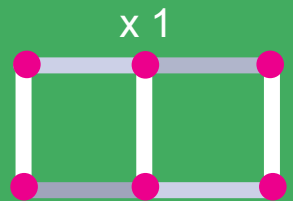
4. Using 4 popsicle sticks join them together with glue to make a square.

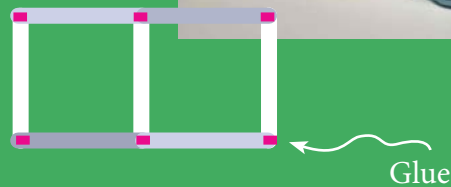
5. Repeat step 4. Add another 3 sticks to the square to make 2 joint squares.



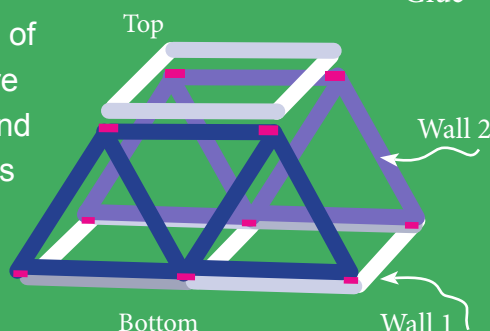
7. Add glue to one sides of the bottom bridge. Place one of your wall trusses to the glue area making sure it sits upright. Hold in place for 6 seconds till it is secure.



8. Repeat for wall 2.



9. Glue the top 4 corners of your wall. Place the square piece on top of the walls and hold in place for 6 seconds till secure.

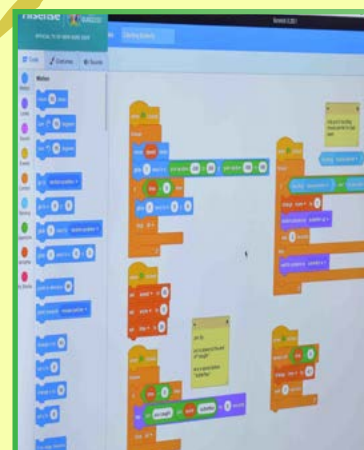
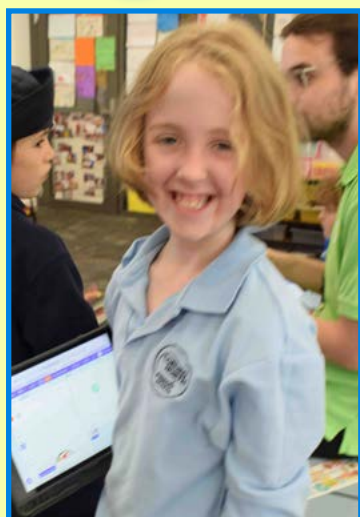

LESS IS MORE

It is important to remember the phrase 'less is more.'

Children find it helpful to have less on in their out of school activities. The less that they are managing than the more chance they do not feel overwhelmed or exhausted. Please be mindful of how many extracurricular activities and play dates that you book in for your child. This approach also allows child to have the time to rest and slow down to help regulate their mind/body.

Change

As we are finishing the year it is important to acknowledge your child's feeling about the transition that is coming up. Change can make children feel a range of emotions which is understandable. Please know that there are some things that you can do to help your child deal with the transition to a new teacher and class.

Take about your positive experiences about that year level

Participate in the whole school transition program.



Read picture story books that has a character dealing with change

Take the time to work through any of these worries. Look at your child/ children's worries in terms of worries that are out of our control and worries that are in our control. The ones that are in our control talk through what are some strategies or solutions to these worries. The worries that are out of our control are still good to say out loud so we can let them go.



Discuss any changes to routines such as who is dropping or picking them up, possibly having specialist classes on different days etc.
